All training was done on the USPS Boston Whaler training boat which showed its capability in the choppy water from the


high winds at Lake Texoma. Cedar Mills Marina graciously offered their facilities for the training which also included classroom work with a Power Point presentation.

Instructors for the program were BOC Certifier Trainers P/R/C Howard Yoas, SN, and P/D/C Scott McDonald, SN. Scott is also the BOC Mid South Regional Director which includes D31. St/C Shirley Heald, AP and R/C Steve Johnson, AP helped with the arrangements for the training.

Many boating skills were demonstrated by the candidates such as constant radius turn, low-speed



turns to show the boat's pivot point, slalom at slow speed, slalom astern, steering range, arriving and departing a mooring, pivot turn, docking and use of spring lines.



Crystal Bridges Museum

The newest jewel to NW Arkansas

Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art is a museum of American art in Bentonville, Arkansas. The museum, founded by Alice Walton and designed by Moshe Safdie, officially opened on November 11, 2011. It offers free public admission.



Alice Walton, the daughter of WalMart founder Sam Walton, spearheaded the Walton Family Foundation's involvement in developing Crystal Bridges. The museum's glass-and-wood design features a series of pavilions nestled around two creek-fed ponds. The complex includes 217,000 square feet of galleries, several meeting and classroom spaces, a library, a sculpture garden, a gift shop, a full service restaurant and coffee bar and a gathering space that can accommodate up to 300 people. Additionally, there are outdoor areas for concerts and public events, as well as extensive nature trails. It employs approximately 160 people, and is within walking distance of downtown Bentonville.

The museum has amassed \$488 million in assets as of August 2008, an amount that will increase as more pieces are continually added to the museum's collection. \$317 million of the project's cost has been donated by Alice Walton. A 2011 Forbes' ranking of the world's richest people placed the WalMart heiress at No. 21, with an estimated net worth of \$21.2 billion.



United States Power Squadrons 100th Anniversary



Created on 2 Feb. 1914, USPS will mark 100 years of education, fellowship and community service in 2014. Based on the powerboat handling skills programs of businessman Roger Upton at the Boston Yacht Club in Marblehead, Mass., USPS offers boating education programs in cities and towns across the U.S., its territories and Japan. The organization has also become an important ally of the U.S. Coast Guard, the Department of Homeland Security, the Department of Commerce and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

Today, nearly 40,000 members in more than 400 squadrons provide boating education in everything from seamanship and celestial navigation to marine electronics and engine maintenance.

Several projects are under way to celebrate USPS' centennial. For more information and activity updates, visit <u>usps.org/100</u>. The <u>Ship's Store</u> is adding 100th anniversary logo items, an anniversary commemorative stamp is under discussion, and community activities are being planned at all levels.

During the 2014 Annual Meeting in Jacksonville, FL, the Governing Board will hold a celebration on Saturday, 1 Feb.

Our meeting hotel, the Hyatt Regency Jacksonville Riverfront is planning a party for all members. The city plans to post signs throughout the town and is working with the Jacksonville Sail & Power Squadron to conduct a boat parade on the St. John's River.

The USPS Flag and Etiquette Committee has designed an anniversary ensign to be flown on members' vessels in 2013 and 2014, and a new logo is available online at the ensign org/foreditors.htm.

To kickoff the yearlong ceremony, anniversary ensigns will be presented to all 32 districts at the 2013 Annual Meeting. Each squadron will create unique ribbon streamers of specified dimensions to affix to their district's ensign. During the 2014 Annual Meeting, districts will parade their ensigns and streamers in an anniversary flag presentation.

All members are encouraged to help plan yearlong celebrations in their communities, including municipal proclamations, appearances at civic and marine organization meetings, and presentations during boating safety equipment demonstration days.
