

The USPS Weather course test was taken on September 4th by five students. They were sent to National for grading and we are waiting for them to return with their critiques.

Our ABC class scheduled for Sept 14th was canceled due to lack of interest.

We are planning on presenting the Navigation Course, now called Offshore Navigation, which is the last class of the Advanced Grades. Anyone that has completed the JN course is eligible to take this course. The class will be scheduled to start in early 2025 lasting 12-14 weeks. Anyone interested in this course please let me know so books can be ordered and other preparations can be made.

We will be coordinating some Co-Op charting trips to inspect Aids to Navigation for Discrepancies and Verify that the Aids position is consistent with the USCG Light List, and perform some bridge surveys for damage or missing signage. Additionally, this year we will try to include some Chart Discrepancy reports to ensure that the charts features are accurate with on-scene observations.


