



The next goal that I have before I turn the command over is to set a five year plan with the help of the Past Commanders. I will be setting a time by the January General meeting for the Past Commanders to get together at the church on a Saturday and have lunch provided at no cost to the Past Commanders. To keep Pennsway a viable educational and safety resource for boating to the community and to USPS members alike, we need to initialize some goals for the next five years.

Here are some of the topics for which goals should be set:

- 1) What is needed to keep our educational programs strong for the nest five years?

- 3) How do we increase involvement within the squadron?
- 4) What types of programs will peak the interest of members?
- 5) What can we do to make the bridge more efficient?

- 8) What type of boating safety programs should we be involved in to generate interest?


- 9) What type of Promotional programs should be used to effectively market our boating safety programs?



QUITE A SCENE AT TURKEY POINT

Having sailed the Chesapeake Bay for most of my adult life, I always enjoy seeing Turkey Point Light when returning to Bohemia River, our home port. It usually means then end of a pleasant sail and tells me we're almost home.

Recently, seen in the June Mariner, an article was written about Turkey Point Light House which I'd like to pass on to Pennsway members.

If your're up to a walk through the country to see some fantastic scenery, drive south down Maryland 272 to its end. Park your car and walk out to Turkey Point Light House (about 8/10 mile one way). Built in the 1830's Turkey Point was an active Light Station until the last keeper, Fannie Mae Salter, retired in 1948. The lighthouse was then automated until the Coast Guard decommissioned her in 2001.

The view from the bluff on which the lighthouse sits is fantastic! On a clear day, you can see for miles down the bay. By the way, the Clint Eastwood movie, Absolute Power, shot a lot of its outdoors shots at Turkey Point. Local lore has it


that a B grade horror movie also features the lighthouse but we can't really confirm that.

A group of local people launched a campaign to rebuild the keeper's house which was demolished in the 1970's due to persistent vandalism. Headed by Dean Rice, a retired teacher, who is trying to achieve this goal.

Editor's note: Pennsway Power Squadron held one of it's first rendezvous at Turkey Point way back in the late 70's. I had the pleasure of sailing there with P/C Walter Whitehead, my sailing mentor, and some 25-30 other members also enjoyed the picnic held at the Point. What great memories.


