Speaking of Civic Service... Come Learn about SERAT!

Civic service is one side of the USPS triangle, and the Squadron Emergency Response Assistance Team (SERAT, pronounced Sea Rat) program is another way that squadrons can fulfill the USPS pledge to "render assistance whenever possible."

Stf/C Jim Strothers, SN, will lead a seminar/training session on Friday. If you'd like to learn more, see the article on page 6 and plan to see Jim in Jacksonville!

What is SERAT? SERAT is a sanctioned arm of the local Power Squadron whose mission is to render volunteer assistance to local fire departments, law enforcement, and other agencies in the event of a water-related emergency. The duties are to provide a team of qualified and experienced boaters with knowledge of local waters who are willing to donate time and effort to assist in the event of an emergency. These may include water rescue, water search and rescue, water-related patrols, and help in securing an area in the event of an emergency.

SERAT standards may require that team members have more specialized or additional equipment than the average boater would have on board, such as special identifying life jackets, identifying lights and flags, and expanded first aid kits. The standards may also require members, depending on level of participation, to have completed advanced USPS courses. All vessels used by SERAT are required to have a current Vessel Safety Check sticker as part of the program.

Public Relations Benefits. Beyond the direct benefits to the community, having a SERAT program helps squadrons be recognized as a community service group. The service identity may help attract new members and skilled boaters who otherwise would not join USPS. Moreover, it provides an incentive for members to pursue advanced USPS education and develop strong on-the-water skills.

Meeting Venue FAQs

Hyatt Rates/Check In/Check Out

- What is the deadline for discounted hotel rates? The Hyatt has provided a block of rooms for our Annual Meeting at \$139/night. This rate is available until
 December, provided rooms are still available. To avoid disappointment, book early! (Please also note the 14 December early-bird discounts available for meals, tours, and activities, as noted on the activity registration form on page 9 and online.)
- 2. What are the check-in/check-out times at the Hyatt? Check in starting at 3PM, check out by noon.

In/Out Transportation and Parking

- How much does it cost to get to the hotel from the airport? The distance is about 15 miles. Go Shuttle charges \$20pp. Yellow Cab charges \$37. Contact them at www.yellowcabflorida.com/northern-floridatransportation-group or call 904-999-9999.
- 4. Can I rent a car? Yes, all major car rental agencies are represented at the Jacksonville International Airport. You can save up to 20% with Budget, as part of your USPS benefits package. Budget's contact number at the airport is 904-741-6770.
- 5. What does it cost to park at the hotel? Hyatt's discounted rate is \$10 self-parking per vehicle per night for USPS overnight guests in the garage. Valet parking is \$20/night.
- 6. Is there day parking near the hotel? Yes, metered parking is available M-F from 0900 until 1800 at \$0.25 per 30 minutes. Street parking is free nights and weekends.
- 7. Is RV parking available? The Hyatt does not have parking for RVs. Visit www.downtownjacksonville.org/Downtown Vision Inc Home.aspx for information regarding parking for downtown Jacksonville.

Hotel Amenities

- 8. Is Wi-Fi available? What is the cost? Wired and Wireless connections are available in guest rooms for \$9.95/night. Complimentary Wi-Fi is available in the hotel lobby. For hotspots, contact www.freehotspot.com.
- 9. Are handicap rooms available? Yes, the Hyatt has 44 ADA-compliant rooms (some Queen/Queen rooms, some King rooms, Some with tubs and some with roll-in showers). For your convenience, they are all within a few rooms of the elevators. When you make your online reservation, you can indicate that you need an accessible room. Need help with ambulatory aids (wheel chairs, motor scooters, oxygen)? Contact the hotel concierge and see www.genesysmedicalequipment.com. Hyatt's ADA rooms easily accommodate scooters. For recharging, please talk to the rental company directly.
- 10. Do all rooms have refrigerators? Refrigerators are available in Premier rooms, VIP, junior, terrace, and ADA rooms. Refrigerators are available upon request for other rooms for a fee of \$25 per stay.

Hotel Shuttle & Other Transportation

- 11. Is there a hotel shuttle? Yes, the Hyatt's complimentary shuttle operates within a 3-mile radius of the hotel Monday through Friday from 0600 until 1000 and then from 1700 until 2100. It will drop you off anywhere within that radius. For return pick-up, please call the hotel (during the time that the shuttle operates).

14. Bus stops? The source for information about bus service is www.jtafla.com. It is a 3-minute walk west to Central Station on West Bay Street. The Jacksonville Transit Authority (JTA) charges a \$1.50 regular cash fare. STAR cards for multiday use may be purchased at Central Station.

Outgoing Packages

- 20. What are the package store hours?
 - There is a FedEx Office Business Center on the 3rd floor of the hotel. It is open 0700–1900 Monday through Friday, and packages may be dropped off anytime during business hours.

Boat Operator Certification and Practical On-The-Water Training Await YOU in Jacksonville!
