has served in marine events, and general marine patrol and several water rescues. Unfortunately the vessel was in storage for over a year with damage that was soo costly to fix within the standard budget of the Sheriff's Office.

Sgt. Matt Smith asked the Coos County Board of Commissioners to use the federal funding allowed to Coos County to renew this marine asset to the Sheriff's Office fleet The Board of Commissioners agreed that this was an acceptable use of federal funding and voted to have this vessel repaired and restored to duty.



Marine Navigation


Marine Navigation is the first course in the sequence of USPS courses on navigation, covering the basics of coastal and inland navigation. This course focuses on navigation as it is done on recreational boats today and embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool while covering enough of traditional techniques so the student will be able to find his/her way even if their GPS fails. The course includes many in-class exercises, developing the student's skills through hands-on practice and learning. Nine classes of two hours each normally are scheduled for presentation of this course. In addition the students have seven days to complete the open book exam. Topics covered include:


- · Charts and their interpretation
- · Navigation aids and how they point to safe water
- · Plotting courses and determining direction and distance
- The mariner's compass and converting between True and Magnetic



- · Pre-planning safe courses and entering them into the GPS
- Monitoring progress and determining position by both GPS and traditional techniques such as bearings and dead reckoning
- The "Seaman's Eve" simple skills for checking that one is on course.

Coos Bay Power Squadron (America's Boating Club) is planning to put on The Marine Navigation Course (Piloting). Marine Navigation (formally Piloting) is the first of the navigational classes focusing on techniques for piloting a boat in coastal and inland conditions. The cost for the course will be \$150.00 for Members / \$200 for Non-Members. A deposit for that amount, will have to be paid No Later Than 1 March, 2023. The tentative start date will be the 22nd of March. The course will meet once a week for about 10 weeks ending the week of the 24th of May.
