15 June/27 July Hartford Squadron CoOp Charting

The Hartford Squadron made its annual CoOp Charting trip on the Connecticut River. A mechanical delayed one boat until 27 July. On the Connecticut River they found 114 ATONs with no discrepancies and 12 with missing numbers, needing paint, and even some obscured by foliage. Another 11 in Hamburg Cove had problems but they are not withing the jurisdiction of the USCG. The discrepancies were all reported to the USCG.
