ED'S DOCK BOX

Are you planning to use Caulks or Sealants on your boat this Spring?

You can make many sealants and caulks to "skin" over more quickly by using a spray bottle to apply a light mist of water to the bead.

The exception: Do not to use with silicones. For best results use caulking and sealants for Marine applications.

Planning to work on your trim tabs? Many use thread-seal tape or plumber's tape on hydraulic trim tabs. DO NOT DO IT!!!! This is NOT RECOMMENDED for hydraulic sys-

tems. If a tiny piece flakes off and gets into the system, it will clog a valve. It will clog a fuel system also, if you use it. Use appropriate pipe dope.

Always look at the sealant or caulking label. Consider what you are trying to bond or seal. Have you selected the right one???

BOATING SAFETY

DOES YOUR INSURANCE HAVE YOU COVERED? Part 2

FUEL SPILL LIABILITY

Suppose your boat sinks or a fuel tank has a leak. You have discharged lots of fuel into the water (some boats=100's of gallons). The marina has to shut down for a day. Under U.S. Federal Law, you can be held liable for up to \$939,800, at least not a million. A policy with specific fuel spill liability up to this amount, protects you from clean-up and third party damage caused by accidental discharge. Some policies just pay up to the policy's liability limits.

Just letting you know some facts. Don't learn the hard way.
