ED'S DOCK BOX

Did you know----solvents or silicone-based products used for water repellent can cause issues with marine fabrics and vinyl? This type of product can leave a residue. The residue causes the fabrics to "yellow" or turn a dingy brown. In most cases, it causes your fabrics to break down and get brittle. You might want to try <u>losso's Water Repellent</u>, which is water based fluoropolymer and won't promote "yellowing". If your seat cushions or other fabric coverings have yellowing, use this and you will see the difference right away.

Take care of your Boat-inside and out!

BOATING SAFETY

It is that time of year: check your Boat Insurance Policy to make sure you have enough coverage and the right coverage. There are 3 major types of insurance.

AGREED HULL VALUE: This is most common. You and your insurer will have to agree on a value of your hull to be paid if the boat is total loss.

ACTUAL CASH VALUE: If your boat becomes a total loss, this pays out on the current market value at the time. It probably will have more depreciation. This type of policy is for boaters who are willing to pay more of the costs out-of- pocket.

LIABILITY ONLY: This only pays for damage caused to others, including personal injury and their property damage. It does not cover your boat, injuries, nor any property.

Just a note to you cruisers—Check your policy considering the distance you cruise off shore and into other states and Canada. You probably are not covered.

Once you decide the type, then you have to add equipment, belongings, and all your other gear to the policy.
