Bow Lights Distribution

Our newsletter, the Bow Lights, is a very large expense item in the 2007 RSPS budget. Each year, 11 editions of around 200 hardcopies of the Bow Lights are being printed and mailed out using a commercial printing/mailing service. At the same time it goes to the printer, the electronic version is available on our website, which makes it available earlier than the hardcopy.

As for myself, once I read the online version of the Bow Lights, I don't really need the mailed version of the Bow Lights anymore. My hardcopy usually ends up untouched in the recycling bin. I, personally, would rather not receive a mailed copy in order to help save some of RSPS's financial resources and also to reduce the waste of our natural resources. Of course, among our membership, points of view in this respect vary widely. We had several discussions during recent ExCom meetings about this topic. Most of the other squadrons of District 27, including District 27 itself, already have switched to a purely electronic distribution of their newsletters. At the same time, we want to ensure that every member of RSPS continues to receive a copy of the Bow Lights in their preferred format; i.e., hardcopy or softcopy (or even both).

We will continue to mail hardcopies as before to every member who wants us to do so, but the electronic version of the Bow Lights will be the default means of distribution starting with the July 2007 edition. Please provide your preference by participating in the short survey below.

You can submit your answer either by mailing the completed form below to me (S. Ufer, 41 S. Swain Street, Raleigh, NC 27601), or by responding to the electronic survey we are currently conducting through the RSPS mailing list. This survey will conclude by **Tuesday June 15th 2007.** Please let us know about your preference before that date. We will include the survey results in the July 2007 edition of the Bow Lights.

In addition, I will send out a test email on June 15^{th} 2007 to all known email addresses of our membership to assure that we have a functioning connection to you through cyberspace. Please let me know, in case you do NOT receive this test email.

New Member Party By Lt/C Burt Pearson, AP



North Carolina's Move-over Law Now Extends to Boating

RALEIGH, N.C. (May 1) – A new "move-over" law for waterways is now in effect for boaters in North Carolina.

Boaters approaching within 100 feet of a law enforcement vessel displaying flashing blue lights must slow down to a no-wake speed and use caution in passing. In narrow channels, the distance becomes within 50 feet of a law enforcement vessel displaying a flashing blue light.

Violators are subject to fines up to \$250 and court costs.

"The immediate area where blue lights are displayed becomes a no wake zone during that time," said Capt. Chris Huebner, boating safety coordinator for N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission, which enforces laws and regulations for inland waterways. "All approaching vessels are required to reduce to idle speed so there is no appreciable wake and it's advisable to maneuver away from or avoid the area, if possible. The law is designed to protect the safety of boaters, law enforcement officers and emergency responders."

The safety measure for waterways is much like the state's move-over law for highways, which requires motorists to move into a lane away from a law enforcement or emergency vehicle with flashing lights, if possible, and to reduce speed.

Vessel Safety Check Program by P/C Lloyd Moore, JN


Being a Vessel Safety Examiner is a rewarding and interesting experience. It's great way to meet new boaters, and you perform a valuable service in the interests of boating safety.

A vessel safety check certifies that the vessel bearing the decal has been inspected and has been found to comply with all federal requirements. There are no penalties to the boat owner if one or more items do not comply. If the vessel is later boarded by the USCG, and deficiencies are found, the owner could be cited and fined.

It's easy to become certified as an examiner. All you have to do is go to the USPS' web site, www.usps.org, and go to the Vessel Safety Check area. You can view the materials online or download and print it. Once you studied the requirements, you can take the qualifying exam online. After that, you will need to perform 5 vessel safety checks under the supervision of any VSE.

If you'd like to become a VSE, go to the USPS web site and study the information and take the exam. Contact Lt/C Stefan Ufer, AP to sign up for the next training session or to get more information.

The net result is that what has usually been a relatively quiet USPS national meeting is going to be a BIG DEAL. The bylaws changes are far-reaching and need to be considered very carefully. You will be seeing and hearing more about this in the next couple of months. While I am on the subject, it is not every day that you have a USPS National Meeting right in your own backyard.
