ON THE WATER ACTIVITIES

When you read this, our first raft-up at Gibson Island will be history. The next event is 14-15 June, at Harness Creek, which is near the mouth of the South River on its north shore. We intend to offer a Skipper Saver course, starting at 1400 on Saturday 14 June, at this raft-up. This is a USPS presentation designed to teach persons who do not usually command a boat about what to do if the skipper falls overboard or otherwise becomes unable to function.

To enter the creek, start to angle to the right after you pass red "8". Do not go directly to the creek entrance from there, as there is a shoal that must be cleared first. Once you are almost south of the entrance, turn to go in the creek, staying to the right. We will try to get the Hurricane Hole (more on that in a moment). If that is not possible we will anchor up the left branch of the creek. Try to contact us in advance on the radio or by cell phone to see where we are. To get to the Hurricane Hole, go up the right branch of the creek. It will look like there is nowhere to go, but at the last minute there is an opening into a small cove on the right. It is so secluded that you will not even be able to see the masts of sailboats anchored in there until you are very close. As noted, if there are already too many boats in there to accommodate our raft, we will go up the left branch.

I expect most participants will prepare and eat their meals aboard. For folks who crave a restaurant, there are at least two not too far upriver. Fuel and other supplies are readily available at Selby Bay and near the Route 2 Bridge.

Pre-registration is not required, but I would appreciate it if people would contact me when you know you are

coming; this helps with planning for the raft and communicating any last-minute information. I can be reached at H: 301.585.6698, Cell: 301.351.6449, or <a href="https://heeple.com/heeple

Current RSPS policy for delivering *the SKIPJACK* is to mail a paper copy to each member household. The Executive Committee is considering a revised policy to send members their *SKIPJACK* via email. Members can still receive their newsletter by regular mail if that is your preference.

Reasons for this initiative are twofold: stewardship and cost containment. We become better stewards of our resources by reducing consumption of paper, toner etc. and, incidentally, relieve some strain on member's mail boxes and paper clutter. Cost containment is essential for efficient and optimal use of available funds. Estimates indicate that currently the Squadron spends \$1.10 per month per member to print, copy, and mail *the SKIPJACK*; sending the newsletter electronically could save over a thousand dollars per year.

We hope that you will elect to receive *the SKIPJACK* electronically each month. Please let us know (contact Cdr Jeff McKinney at jmckinney10@verizon.net) if this is a feasible or acceptable alternative for you. GPS SEMINARS

We are prepared to conduct several two hour seminars based on the USPS "Using GPS' material. The session will describe details of the NAVSTAR GPS system, Waypoint Navigation techniques and features of a typical marine GPS Receiver. More details on the seminar are listed below.

Currently two seminar sessions, 25 June 25 and 9 July, 2008, are scheduled. Other sessions are possible to satisfy demand. Each session will be held in the conference room at Dick's Sporting Goods in the Gaithersburg Washingtonian Center beginning at 1900.
