Education Report

Happy New Year everyone! 2018 fast forward to the future! How many of you are taking the online Webinars? I recently took the Oceanography: Ocean currents and Computer Navigation. The Webinar consist of taking a look at Tidal and Ocean currents and how they affect navigation planning and when underway navigation, software that will retrieve and use RTOFS (Real Time Ocean Forecast Systems) data.

This information is available free from NOAA and you can overlay the data on your charts using the United States Power Squadron, Open CPN Navigation Software and once again, it is free.

One interesting thing I learned was how surface wind affect current down to 500 meters also currents from the Gulf Stream plus sea temperature. I found this information to be a valuable source of information for fishing near shore and offshore.

The Lack of Knowledge Boating Education

It is amazing to me but it should not be by now when it comes to the lack of boating education concerning rescues by the United States Coast Guard. Not only boaters but kayaks, canoes, and paddle boards most are current and wind related and broken paddles. As for boaters running out of fuel, breakdowns, taking on water, running aground, weather related and overdue.

Thought Process! Update your chart software at least check the Local Notices to Mariners they are free. The United States Coast Guard will e-mail them to you weekly all you have to do is read them and make notes on you charts.

File a float plan, if not at least invest in a PLB (Personal Locator Beacon.) When you register your PLB with NOAA you are assigned a number. If you are ever in a situation and you need to use it set it off do not wait until it becomes a life and death situation. The cost of the unit is a small price to pay when it comes to your life!

Boating class

Instructors mark your calendar for ABC Boating Course. Spring Dates are Saturday 07 April and Saturday 14 April. Fall dates are Saturday 15 September and Saturday 22 September.

NC State Fish Barn

What is a Fish Barn you may ask? The Fish Barn is a research, demonstration and teaching unit, which is focused on intensive aquaculture production with a particular emphasis on closed recirculating systems.

The North Carolina Fish Barn project at North Carolina State University (NCSU) has been active in the evaluation and development of recirculating technology for the intensive production of fish since 1989. It is operated as a demonstration project for the development and evaluation of water reuse technology suitable for conducting commercial aquaculture in the water-limited Piedmont of North Carolina

Lorraine arranged for interested and available members of the squadron to tour the facility off Lake Wheeler Road in Raleigh on Friday, 10 November. Sally and Phil, Barbara and Robert, Joan and Steve, Steve Boshart and Lorraine enjoyed the informative tour.

There were two separate buildings, one housed the hydroponic lettuce production, which is in a controlled environment greenhouse and housed tanks of tilapia. The fish production system had a nursery tank, and four grow out tanks, which also had tilapia and flounder.




