





Fellow squadron members,

We held our first squadron meeting of the Fall season on Thursday, the 19th of September at the pavilion in Bacon Woods of the Vermilion River Reservation. It was 'picnic style,' as 11 USPS members participated, 9 from Vermilion and 2 from Stark County Power Squadron. The squadron treated with pizza and salad, and the home-made Pineapple cake was courtesy of Mary Anne. My 'Thanks' to Mary Anne and Dave for creating and hosting this unique venue.

Our most important business was centered around our application for a grant from the Wellington Eagles Ladies Auxiliary, Aerie #2051, for the purchase of a new computer, to be used primarily for our training needs. The Kastl's will create a prototype, with specifications, along with a letter to the auxiliary, explaining its justification and intended use. The squadron will have a chance to review their report and act accordingly.

In other business, Cathe Radabaugh and I will attend the Fall District 7 conference, on October 26th. It's actually near-by, in Talmadge, Ohio, so we encourage you to consider joining us.

Our monthly meeting is on October 17th. in Wellington, so I do hope to see your there. Celestially speaking; October is a rather quiet month, but does provide us with a Supermoon. A Supermoon is a full moon or a new moon that nearly coincides with perigee, (the closest that the moon come to earth in its elliptic orbit,) resulting in a slightly larger-than-usual apparent size of the lunar disk as viewed from earth. October's Supermoon will be on October 17th. and will also be identified as a Hunters Moon, Travel Moon or Blood Moon. October's Hunters Moon will be the closest Supermoon in calendar year 2024.

So **why** all the hype over the moon anyway? First off, as we all know, the moon doesn't change size, but its proximity to the earth does, and it's dramatic. Now, having said that, in its 'closeness,' there is increased 'brightness,' and factually, that is the difference! Some 15% brighter difference! So, as the song goes, "Shine-on, Shine on Hunter's moon, up in the sky, I ain't had no lov'in since......." I've read before we called them Supermoons, in astronomy,



- If you want to share a recent trip or adventure, we would love to hear about it.



A thought or 3, on DOCK lines;

*First off, you should carry at least two springs, that are a quarter longer than your boat is from stem to stern.


Secondly, the diameter of the eye splice in a dock line should be at least 3 times the piling or bollard it fits over.

Thirdly, A long eye splice is safer & last longer than a short one, because a short one tends to pull apart at the throat when tension is applied.


